

Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration (PBHCI) Program Specific Guidance

Guidance on Indicators

1. For your grants, think “primary care-related” wherever the Overview of Indicators Guide mentions “mental health-related.”
2. **For indicator Policy Development: PD1.** The number of policy changes completed:
 - Include any financing policy changes (previously captured under indicator F2).
 - Include any licensing policy changes (previously captured under indicator WD4).
3. **For indicator Workforce Development: WD1.** The number of organizations implementing mental health-related training programs:

Question: Do contracted out organizations count under WD1?

Answer: Yes, an organization that you have contracted with to conduct trainings for consumers should be counted under WD1. However, you should count the organization(s) implementing the training only when a NEW training is implemented and not each time they conduct a training.

Note: Do *not* count the number of people trained under WD1.
4. **For indicator Financing: F1.** The amount of additional funding obtained for specific mental health-related practices/activities:
 - Include any “revenue” in the forms of Medicaid, foundations, etc. (previously captured under indicator F3).
5. **For indicator Referral: R1.** The number of individuals referred to mental health or related services:
 - For the purposes of your grant, since you are tracking referrals, you should count the referrals that are made to doctors/programs that are not a part of the grant program. For example, if a doctor is funded by the grant, you would not include a referral to that doctor in R1. If a doctor is not funded by the grant, but is conceptually a part of the grant program, again you would not include referrals to that doctor.
